Mon 1st February is the feast of St Brigid, abbess, secondary Patron of Ireland.

Tue 2nd February is the feast of The Presentation of the Lord. Today is also the World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life. This is the day when we bless candles for use in the church during the coming year. Candles and offerings for same may be handed in at any time.

Wed 3rd February is the memorial of St Blaise. The blessing of St Blaise is a sign of our faith in God's protection and love for us and for all who are sick.

Fri 5th February is the memorial of St Agnes, virgin and martyr. She is honoured as the patron of bell founders.

Archbishop's Statement: Archbishop Kieran O' Reilly sent to priests this week a brief Statement addressed to undertakers, priests and the people of the diocese. In it he encourages us all to be mindful of the current public health advice in relation to funerals. Among other points, he notes that numbers should be limited to ten persons, and gatherings should be avoided in churches and cemeteries, as well as in homes.

Level 5 Covid 19 Restrictions and what they mean for our faith community

At Level 5, the public health risk means that you will be asked to stay at home, with certain exceptions. There will be no gatherings other than small numbers at funerals and weddings. **Religious services**

Religious services move online. **Sunday Mass 11.00 am** broadcast on Parish Radio and live streamed on parish website doonparish.ie

Places of worship may remain open for private prayer. The Church will be open from after Mass until 6pm each day.

Funerals

Up to 10 mourners can attend.

Weddings

Up to 6 guests are permitted to attend a wedding ceremony and reception, whether indoors or outdoors.

Domestic travel restrictions

Stay at home.

Exercise as close to home as possible.

You must stay within your county unless you need to leave for essential purposes, as follows:

- * travel to and from work, where work involves providing an essential service
- * to attend medical appointments and collect medicines and other health products
- * travel to attend disability day services
- * travel to attend a court
- * for vital family reasons, such as providing care to children, elderly or vulnerable people, and in particular for those who live alone but excluding social family visits
- * for farming purposes (food production or care of animals)
- * to attend a wedding or funeral
- * to visit a grave
- *
